Adult Day Care Programs provide a secure environment and therapeutic activities to help participants achieve optimal physical, mental and cognitive functioning. The programs improve the quality of life for older adults by reducing social isolation and increasing social and community engagement. Adult Day Care provides assistance to families and caregivers who care for an adult who may not be able to be left unattended or who can benefit from supervised socialization. This service may also provide respite (an opportunity for a caregiver to take a break from their caregiving duties). *This is a fee for service program offered weekdays*.

The Office of the Public Guardian ensures the physical and financial safety of persons unable to do so on their own, and when there are no viable alternatives to a public conservatorship. Services are defined and directed by the Superior Court. The Superior Court can appoint the Public Guardian as a conservator of the person only, estate only (for probate) or both person and estate.

The El Dorado Transit Authority provides four local bus routes serving the west slope of El Dorado County. They also offer a number of special services:

**ADA Paratransit/Off-Route Deviation Services** is a specialized transportation service for persons who are unable to independently use regular bus route service due to a disability or health-related condition some or all of the time; must be certified as eligible. Application for this service is available through El Dorado Transit.

**El Dorado Commuter** provides eleven morning trips from El Dorado County to Sacramento and eleven return trips in the afternoon. It is a fast, easy way to commute to downtown Sacramento.

**50X** provides service hourly between Placerville and the Iron Point Light Rail Station in Folsom; this is a limited stop route that serves Park and Ride locations, Folsom Lake College (Folsom and ED campuses), Cameron Park and the Tribal Health clinic along the Highway 50 Corridor.
